Homework

Thank you to parents/carers who took the time to complete the feedback form online after our recent parent/carer meetings before half term. The main feedback we received was surrounding homework. Homework will be sent home on a Friday and is expected back the following Friday to give families time including a weekend to complete it.

We aim to create an approach to homework that enables children to reinforce their classroom learning at home and give parents/carers the opportunity to help their child to make improved progress in their learning. In doing this we also strive to ensure that homework does not place onerous demands on children and their parents/carers and we recognise that children should be able to take part in other after school activities in order to develop fully in their own areas of interest.

Guidelines for EYFS

- Reading and sharing books daily; adults to keep a signed record in the Reading Diary.
- Half-termly 'Learning Menus' ideas linked to the half term's learning journey for parents/ carers to try at home and post photos and comments on Tapestry.
- Children may be given additional 'top-up' practice of phonic sounds and/or common exception words.

Guidelines for KS1

Reading/sharing books with parents/carers (including verbal questioning) at least 3 times a week and keep a signed record in the Reading Diary.

- Half-termly 'Learning Menus' ideas linked to the half term's learning journey for parents/ carers to try at home to research/support learning in school.
- Children will be given a list of spellings to learn which will follow the spelling patterns taught in their phased groups or linked to curriculum.
- A piece of written maths or grammar homework.

Bonfire Night

We hope you all enjoy a safe and enjoyable bonfire night this weekend. We have spoken with the children in assembly about wearing gloves and having a bucket of water or sand at the ready to put out sparklers as well as staying a safe distance away from bonfires and fireworks.
