Attendance and Leave of Absence requests

We are aware that times are difficult and that families are under much greater financial pressures at the moment, but we must ask parents/carers to **not book holidays during school term time**.

We are receiving a high number of Leave of Absence requests for holidays which is affecting school attendance and pupil learning. Pupils should attend school for 190 days each year. Over their time in school, children who are absent/late have their education disrupted considerably:

- 1 day per week of absence = Two and a half years of missed education
- 10 days per year of absence = Two terms of missed education
- 15 minutes of lateness per day = One year of missed education

We would really value your help and cooperation in this matter to help give your children the best start possible. Thank you.

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Nuneaton SEND Parents/ Carers Training

We are delighted to share with you that Louisa McGivney, a specialist, and consultant in Autism, will be delivering a series of 6 free workshop sessions aimed at parents and carers of children and young people on the Autism spectrum and those with complex communication needs.

Each session will be delivered on a Friday morning from 10.00am-12.00pm, with light refreshments available to those attending the sessions.

There will be a series of sessions focusing on a range of topics, which include:

- Week 1- Friday 4th November 22: Understanding your child and their Autism
- Week 2 Friday 11th November 22: Supporting your child with self-care and independence
- Week 3 Friday 18th November 22: Supporting your child and their sensory processing differences
- Week 4 Friday 25th November 22: Supporting your child and their behaviours
- Week 5 Friday 2nd December 22: Supporting your child with their learning
- Week 6 Friday 9th December 22: Supporting your child with transitions

The aim of each session will be to:

- To raise an awareness of how Autism/CCN affect your child
- To develop a shared understanding of some of the challenges that our children face, and the strengths they can bring
- · To increase your confidence in understanding and supporting your child
- To build up a bank of ideas and strategies that can be used to support your child

All sessions will be held at Nuneaton Library. Whilst we appreciate you may not be able to attend every session due to work/family commitments; we do ask that you attend week 1 as this provides the foundation for the remaining sessions, and that you are able to commit to at least three of the following sessions.
